

Sermon Questions

Exodus 2

This week we discussed God's sovereign orchestration for every single person's life. We learned in the Word of God that every human being is fearfully and wonderfully made (Psalm 139) and that we are God's masterpiece (Ephesians 2:10). He has set the times and locations for us to live (Acts 17) and desires to use our lives for His glory. As believers in Christ, we often ask the question, "What is God's plan for my life?" or concern ourselves with the belief that we are not living out our destiny. In Exodus 2, we learn that God is always in control and by relying completely on Him and seeking Him first, He will certainly use us for His glory. As you listen to the message, consider how special you are to the Lord and how He is using you even when you don't realize it. May the Lord give you great hope and remind you of His incredible love for you as you seek Him.

Questions

1. When the King of Egypt feared the influence of Israel and issued a decree to murder all the baby boys, how does God respond? What is the significance of Moses growing up in the house of Pharaoh? How will that one day help with His calling from the Lord?

2. What did God develop for you in your formative years? What did He bless you with? What did you lack? Where did you live? For how long? What was significant about how you were raised? How has your formative years helped you to see the world “clearly” through your own lens?
3. Why should we NOT compare our upbringing and pathway to anyone else’s? Why is our unique upbringing and pathway exactly what God wanted for us? How were your experiences as a youth beneficial to you? How have you seen God’s pathway for your purpose lived out?
4. When Moses kills an Egyptian, how does it show what is “hardwired” in His design? What’s the significance of Moses acting as a deliverer?
5. When Moses sees two of his own countrymen fighting what does he say? Why? How do the men respond to Moses? Why do they accuse him of being a ruler or judge? What is the significance of others seeing your gifting before you see it? Why should we pay attention to what others see in us? What have others affirmed in you? What have others pejoratively said about you?
6. How has God consistently used you in a group of people? Your voice? Leadership? Service? Encouragement? Administration? Compassion? Unity? Have you realized that you have always been who you are right now?
7. What do you do effortlessly? What have you always been afforded the opportunity to do? How have people trusted you? What makes you mad? Upset? Sad? Frustrated? Disappointed? How does your unique wiring help you to see the world clearly through your lens?
8. Why does God use obstacles to help you grow? What are some obstacles you see in the lives of other Christians? What obstacles were placed in the life of Christ? What obstacles has God used in your life?
9. What are some of the hurtful things that have been said to you? How have they been wounding? What is the calling on your life that was wounded and frustrated by those words? How is God calling you to rebound?
10. What are ways the enemy has flaunted some things in front of you to keep you from God’s best? How have you chosen to pursue God instead of the things of this world?
11. What does it mean that God may have you serve in obscurity before He has elevated you to your destiny? Are you being faithful in the small things? Are you doing all that you can so that if God chooses to elevate you that you will be ready?
12. Why would God choose a specific and unique curriculum for you? How is God still educating your life?

13. Why is God's timing so important for your destiny? What is the significance of Moses fleeing to Midian when He was 40? Being called when He was 80? Why does God take His time developing His people? What might God be doing behind the scenes to ready other people for your destiny?
14. How is your destiny designed to be a blessing to others and not just personal fulfillment? How can you experience God's orchestration in your life? How can you seek Him first in all things? Meditate on His Word? Spend time hearing His voice? Being obedient?
15. What was your greatest take-a-way this week? What application do you need to make in your life right now?
